

## NWGB DONATES ITS DISPOSAL ASSETS TO NEEDY SCHOOL



The North-West Gambling Board through its Supply Chain Management Department donated assets and inventories to four schools in the Mahikeng Local Municipality. After a thorough inspection it was deemed fit to donate assets and inventories which no longer provided the required benefit to the Board. The Board's loss and disposal committee identified four needy schools in the municipality's periphery communities. Among these assets are computers, office equipment, furniture and fittings.

In addition to this a Hoover, notebook, tablet, laptops, colour printers and a vacuum cleaner were also donated. Chairperson of the NWGB assets and disposal committee Mr. Daniel Kgabi maintained that the initiative was to the benefit of learners and schools in the province's marginalized communities "This initiative benefited an overall number of one thousand eight hundred fifty learners in all four identified schools. These schools include Ipelegeng and Modimola Primary Schools, Jan Masibi High School and Saane Middle School."

For learners like Paseka Thulo a Grade 9 learner at Saane Middle School in Modimola village, the donation signals a start of good things. "I'm delighted that about the donation I hope that in the near future the Board will adopt our school and give us bursaries to further our studies so that we can plough back in our communities."

At the time of the donation Batlharo Primary School near Disaneng village had only one laptop which was used by the Principal and the school's administrative clerk. "Our School now has two laptops and this will go a long way in assisting us to do our work timeously" said principal Moses Phaedi.
